Amy Simon Pronouns: She/Her President/CEO & Founding Partner LGBT Senior Housing and Care, LLC.



This week Pride worker is Amy Simon! For the past six years, she has focused on specific efforts on providing organization/ project management, research, public relations and communications in the areas of LGBTQ senior advocacy and housing. In addition to creating the first LGBTQ senior program at an assisted living facility in New Jersey, she also worked with the state Ombudsman's Office to help craft the language for NJS2545, legislation that mandates staff LGBTQ sensitivity training as a licensing requirement for

all senior living facilities in the state of New Jersey. Her goals are as stated ""As a lifetime activist I am driven to fill a need in our community and bring people together in a common goal of dignity and healing. Through my work as a communications specialist

in LTC I had a front row seat to the growing elder community in our country and the invisible and traumatized LGBTQ+ persons among them who had no housing options, acute financial disparities from their cis-hetero peers and greater rates of physical and mental health disparities. Inspired by the work of SAGE and the HRC I decided to dedicate the remainder of my working career to help ameliorate this growing crisis in

LGBTQ+ elder services."
